The Charity

Since 1860 Providence Row has been providing services for homeless people in London. It was the first non-sectarian organisation of its kind and continues to provide services to anyone who needs help on their pathway out of homelessness, regardless of their backgrounds.

A registered charity, Providence Row has always relied on the help and support of others to continue its work in helping vulnerable people.

The Challenge

A half-day corporate challenge to cook and serve breakfast for the visitors to Providence Row's Dellow Centre.

Up to 200 homeless and vulnerably housed people visit the Dellow Centre every morning for breakfast before being seen by Providence Row's project workers for such things as housing, benefits and health advice.

Our breakfast service is a vital core services we provide and is available to anyone who needs it.
